THE TWELVE STEPS

- (1) We admitted we were powerless over alcohol...that our lives had become unmanageable.
- (2) Came to believe that a Power greater than ourselves could restore us to sanity.
- (3) Made a decision to turn our will and our lives over to the care of God as we understood Him.
- (4) Made a searching and fearless moral inventory of ourselves.
- (5) Admitted to God, to ourselves, and to another human being the exact nature of our wrongs.
- (6) Were entirely ready to have God remove all these defects of character.
- (7) Humbly asked Him to remove our shortcomings.
- (8) Made a list of all persons we had harmed and became willing to make amends to them all.
- (9) Made direct amends to such people wherever possible, except when to do so would injure them or others.
- (10) Continued to take personal inventory and when we were wrong promptly admitted it.
- (11) Sought through prayer and meditation to improve our conscious contact with God as we understood Him, praying only for knowledge of His will for us and the power to carry that out.
- (12) Having had a spiritual awakening as the result of these Steps, we tried to carry this message to alcoholics, and to practice these principles in all our affairs.


Alcoholics Anonymous is a fellowship of men and women who share their experience, strength and hope with each other that they may solve their common problem and help others to recover from alcoholism.

The only requirement for membership is an honest desire to stop drinking. AA has no dues or fees. It is not allied with any sect, denomination, politics, organization or institution, does not wish to engage in any controversy, neither endorses nor opposes any causes. Our primary purpose is to stay sober and help other alcoholics to achieve sobriety.

"BUT FOR THE GRACE OF GOD"

Sobriety is the most important thing in your life without exception. You may believe your job, or your home life, or one of many other things come first. But consider, if you do not get sober and stay sober, chances are you won't have a job, a family, sanity, or even life. If you are convinced that everything in life depends on your sobriety, you have just so much more chance of getting sober and staying sober. If you put other things first you are only hurting your own chances.

Structure & Services of A. A.

Alcoholics Anonymous is not organized in the formal or political sense. There are no governing officers, no rules or regulations, no fees or dues.


The need for certain services was, however, apparent from the beginning. Inquiries had to be answered. Literature had to be written, printed and distributed. Requests for help from individuals and Groups throughout the world had to be handled.

Today A.A. has five service agencies at the national and international level. Each one was created to meet distinct needs. Four of them are related directly to the parent agency, The General Service Board.

To support these services which help assure A.A. unity and growth, the Groups are asked to make voluntary contributions at the rate of two dollars per year per member. Membership in A.A. is in no way contingent upon this support. All accounts are CPA audited and financial reports are submitted. The invitation to contribute is issued twice yearly because many groups do not at the present time contribute to the support of A.A.'s basic services.

The informal structure of A.A. assures the means whereby a variety of essential services can be provided both within the fellowship itself and to other alcoholics who turn to the movement for help.

General Service Conference



Established in 1951, the General Service Conference of A.A. is the link between the local Groups and the General Service Board of A.A., formerly The Alcoholics Foundation.

(The Board is the custodian of A.A. Traditions. It handles national and international public relations matters. As the parent service agency, it is responsible for the integrity and service standards of General Service Headquarters, A.A. Publishing, Inc. and The A.A. Grapevine, Inc.)

The General Service Conference has its roots in the Groups (See chart) which send Group Representatives to A.A. Assemblies. At these Assemblies, the Group Representatives: (1) name an Area Committee to serve during the two-year rotation period and (2) name an Area Delegate to the annual Conference at General Service Headquarters.

Delegates meet for several days each Spring to: (1) receive and evaluate reports on A.A.'s national and international service facilities, (2) discuss matters of general A.A. interest or concern, and (3) to advise Members of the Board on the best ways of fulfilling A.A.'s primary purpose which is to carry the recovery message to "the millions who still don't know." The Conference is exclusively a consultative, service agency.

Two reports are issued following each meeting of Delegates. A special digest, "Conference Highlights" is sent to each local Group for review and discussion. Delegates and Area Committeemen receive a detailed "Final Report" which records every key item discussed at the Conference.

An increasing number of Groups now make it a practice to set aside one or more closed meetings each year for discussion of these reports.


