March 10, 2019

Steve S., Chairperson, Panel 69, opened the meeting with the Declaration of Unity. Steve then gave a reading from the AA Group Pamphlet.

At NERAASA Steve came away with some questions to ponder. One was, what are we selling at EPGSA? Information on what's going on at the General Service Conference and how we can get this information back to the GSR and then the home group.

Alt. Delegate Report. Written report submitted. A stamped and preaddressed postcard is given to each DCM to send to our Delegate during the General Service Conference. 42/48 districts were represented at the DCM orientation. All agenda items were distributed to our Intergroups in area 59. A Google drive has been created for all of the General Service Conference agenda items.

Delegate Report. Written report submitted. Please always feel free to contact our Delegate with any questions. For the General Service Conference background information we are trying to reduce the use of paper. At the General Service Conference everything is digitized.

AA World Services and the Grapevine Inc. will be on a new business platform. World Services is not taking over Grapevine. Financially AA World Services is fairly sound. Literature profits provide about 27% of the budget. The General Service Board is looking for easier ways for members to get agenda items on the Conference.

The area committee has the responsibility for hosting EPGSA. Ken has asked our Structure Committee to look into changing the wording so that the current Delegate has a voice and a vote on the Convention Committee. This to further develop a stronger level of trust.

For the Pre-Conference Sharing Session, any Spanish speaking member on a discussion roundtable will have an interpreter available. Any agenda item back round information is available to any member.

Sub-Committee Reports

Archives: written report submitted. The committee decided to back off on digitizing items and instead focus on organizing the storage facility. A letter was sent to all other areas asking if they enlist the services of outside organizations to digitize their records, and what has been their learning curve in the process. They also asked if any share in office space facilities. Based on their responses so far, no other areas are focused on digitizing.

A strong focus is given to developing a naming convention for digitized materials to aid in research.

CPC: written report submitted. Displays are being updated and the literature packages are being put together for districts to use in outreach to medical facilities and other professional services. The CPC committee is in the process of approaching hospitals in an effort to get our materials in the emergency rooms.

Corrections: written report submitted. The corrections committee is in the process of making new displays. District 34 is requesting a Bridging the Gap program from the corrections subcommittee. A federal penitentiary on the border between Area 60 and 59 would like to have an AA meeting.

Finance: written report submitted. A PowerPoint presentation was given showing spending and contribution trends as well as a thorough layout of the budget process. It was noted that our budget is not written in stone and can be amended over time as needed.

Over previous years the trend has been overestimating our expenses. The committee will focus heavily on obtaining a more accurate estimate of expenses.

The Chairperson took over to ask the full committee to vote on the three agenda motions and further asked to bundle the three into one. The full committee accepted by unanimous consent.

The motion; 1. The finance subcommittee unanimously recommends that Area 59 contribute \$6500 to the General Services Office in addition to the Delegate's minimum conference fee of \$1800. 2. The finance subcommittee unanimously recommends that Area 59 contribute \$750 to the Pennsylvania Hospitality Committee for the 2020 International AA Convention. 3. The finance subcommittee unanimously recommends that Area 59 adopt its fiscal year 2019 budget proposal.

The motion carried with unanimous consent.

Grapevine: written report submitted. The Grapevine committee is active getting out to events in other districts. They would like to compile a list of all Grapevine representatives for home groups in our area.

Public information: written report submitted. The PI committee is looking into a way for tracking the use of the area website. The committee will be handing out a survey sheet to DCM's and officers seeking ways to improve the website and public information in general.

Treatment Facilities, Accessibilities: focusing on Bridging the Gap. The committee is looking into ways to increase awareness on any special needs that members may have at meetings.

Structure: written report submitted. The subcommittee is prepared and eager to attend as many area functions as possible please feel free to invite them. The main focus of the committee is to change the Convention Committee charter wording in the Structure Manual. Many past delegates have been contacted for input.

Literature: written report submitted. More literature displays have been purchased. Five members of the literature committee attended the NERAASA, quite an accomplishment given that they are alternate DCM's.

The presentation was given on the God Word pamphlet.

Unfinished business: acceptance of Delegate's recommendations 22 through 27. The recommendations were accepted by unanimous consent.

Chairperson made announcements of future events.

Motion and second to close, unanimous consent.

Meeting closed at 3:40PM with the declaration of responsibility.
