Your input on select agenda items was very useful and informative, and I was able to draw upon some of the points you made when I went to the microphone to speak in favor or against various recommendations that came out of committee.

When we meet at the Mini-Assemblies, I will report back to you on the advisory actions, the committee considerations, and the items for which no action was taken. I will also share how I voted, the reasons I voted as I did, and the vote tallies, which I tracked carefully this year, knowing it's important to some to know these details.

One of the actions I'm most proud of came out of the committee I chaired, Policy/Admissions. It may not be relevant to all A.A. members, as the revision to the Preamble or the decision to develop a Fifth Edition of the Big Book were last year. But it felt vitally important to ensure equity and inclusion among the General Service Structure: we made a game-changing recommendation regarding translation of General Service Conference background material. As we reviewed the Equitable Distribution of Workload report on year one of the three-year pilot period, looked back at the Report on Translation and Interpretation of General Service Conference Material we were given last year, and knowing how delayed the French and Spanish translations were this spring, we came forward with a recommendation that was considered by the Conference body as a whole.

After an amendment, it read: **The committee recommended that the compilation of all conference committee background be made available simultaneously in English, French, and Spanish.**

While this may mean that the Office will not be able to hit the February 15 mark, we acknowledged that a slight delay would be worthwhile to ensure our French- and Spanish-speaking members have equitable access to the background information and no longer feel like second-class members. We will see this take effect in early 2023, in advance of the 73rd General Service Conference!

There were dozens of other actions taken as a result of the 72nd, and I look forward to sharing them with

**MONDAY:** Get the mail and process contributions. (If you're "lucky", the number will be under 5.) Processing consists of some combination of the following: marking the back of the checks with the Area "stamper"; depositing them using the bank's mobile app; entering the transactions into the accounting software – if the group has not been entered into the system; its information is cross-referenced with a group list provided by the Officer at Large; generating thank you letters in Microsoft Word; folding the letters and putting them into the matching envelope, making sure to include a remittance envelope for future contributions; sealing the envelopes and adding a stamp; placing the envelopes in the "to mail" pile on the desk.

**TUESDAY:** Get the mail and process contributions. Process newly submitted expense reports: enter the information into the accounting software; verify receipts; write the check; print the envelope; add the stamp and place in the "to mail" pile on the desk.

**WEDNESDAY:** Go to the mailbox and drop off everything in the "to mail" pile from the desk. Get the mail and process contributions. Attend a subcommittee meeting for which you are the advisor. Process a newly received expense report.

**THURSDAY:** Get the mail and do a "happy dance" since there is no mail for the treasurer. Remember to write a check to the facility hosting the next Area event. Attend another subcommittee meeting for which you are the advisor. Begin putting together the documents needed for the upcoming Area meeting.

**FRIDAY:** Get the mail and process contributions, *plus* the paper expense report. Go to the mailbox and drop off envelopes. Answer a question received about Area finances. Process a newly submitted online expense report.

**SATURDAY:** Get the mail and process contributions. It's the end of the month, which means time to "balance

literature projects.

Although the week may be fictional, and the “t” in “treasurer” can certainly feel like “time consuming”, what this service position has really taught me is gratitude. I truly had no idea how much time and energy are spent by treasurers everywhere, just to keep things running, and making sure our 7th Tradition dollars are available to help fulfill our primary purpose. Thank you to all past and future treasurers for your service!

Speaking of finances and the 7th Tradition, the Area is doing well, with spending and contributions roughly where they should be vs. the budget. One trend to note is that expenses for in-person events are definitely higher than in the past, especially the cost of food and facility rental fees. The Area’s operating account balance continues to decrease, due to the resumption of in-person events, plus the work being done by our subcommittees, including the special projects that were part of the budget.
