I was told when I first started in the Program of Alcoholics Anonymous; that you never say "No" to any service you are asked to perform; because you can never repay all of the blessings this Program has given to you.

I remember when I was first introduced to the Program of Alcoholics Anonymous in 1987, sitting in the back of the meeting rooms feeling broken, hopeless and full of fear. I was told by "seasoned members" to move to the front of the room; and begin to get involved into the service part of the Program of Alcoholics Anonymous. Service will force you to get out of yourself and into helping something else greater than yourself. To this day my homegroup is The Tuesday Night Williamsport Group; where I

began to get involved in service. I was asked to be a "greeter"; which I really didn't like, because I didn't like members hugging me. I was asked to make coffee; which I don't drink. I was asked to be secretary & chair the meeting; I didn't want to because I had a fear of speaking in front of people. I was asked to be treasurer; but I knew I had an issue with other people's money. But I was always told.... never say No to a service commitment. So, I took suggestions and did what I was told to do. Service commitments have made me dependable and consistent in my recovery. Service commitments also have taken me out of my comfort zone, by not allowing the fear to overtake me when I am placed in front of people to speak. However, I still get the jitters sometimes. Service has provided me the opportunity to become the Treasurer and then the Secretary of Area 59. My service journey has taken me to conferences, conventions and due to the pandemic, to zoom meeting rooms around the world. Today, I have a Service Sponsor, who still pushes me to take service commitments when I don't want to. I have a 12 step Sponsor, who I still meet with weekly to make sure, I am staying on the path. I have Sponsees who know I will add their names on any volunteer event or newcomer phone list before they even have a chance to sign up for themselves. I tell them like my Sponsor tells me, we need to stay in the middle of this thing so we don't fall off the edge, as we navigate the service journey of sobriety and recovery.

So, remember when asked to do something that is service related...never say No to Service. It could be the most rewarding experience of your life; and as for me, I could never repay what the Program of Alcoholics Anonymous has given me; by not saying No to Service!

The inaugural Ad hoc Digital Communications Subcommittee commenced with Panel 71, born from an emerging need to utilize electronic means to unify the Fellowship and facilitate the work of general service in eastern Pennsylvania. The committee currently has 4 DCMs as voting members: Jonathan K. D34, Lauren R. D57, Joe L. D49, and Claire B. D44. Our main goal for this panel was to redesign and oversee the Area website, area59aa.org. Early in 2021 we had the great fortune of enlisting two highly skilled colleagues and immediately set to work. Our new Web Servant, Scott F., is a professional web designer with previous experience creating the website for ABE Intergroup in Bethlehem, PA. Our new Assistant Web Servant, Lenny T., comes to us with expertise he gained managing District 25's website. The fact that we were joined by these proficient and motivated members means that we were able to custom-design, build, and maintain the website "in-house" without having to outsource any work.

We had some challenges ironing out exactly how to organize the tremendous amount of content in a way that would best serve our Area. Some of the website development meetings involved welcome input from the Technology Committee, and we were always superbly supported by us Tech Servant, Fred S., and our Area Advisor, Alicia S., who serves as Officer-at-Large. We do hope that we have made decisions which increase access to the information you seek. Our website remains a living organism in the sense that it is continually nurtured, enhanced, and improved. On a regular basis you will find fresh items and up-to-the-minute information, so visit often!

Some brief highlights:

- HOME. Here you will find a rotating main event or highlight along with 4 boxes that mimic info in the header bar. Bridging the Gap lives in the 5th box, and the 6th box previews the next main event or highlight. In this way we always have some fresh content for upcoming events, and we always have some content that remains constant and reliable.
- ABOUT AA. Although our website is primarily used to aid communication within the Fellowship, what if a newcomer lands on our page? We feel it is critical that we remain "the hand of AA." We provide

- a "Need Help Now" button with links to our local hotlines and info at AA.org.
- FIND A MEETING. According to website user data that we continually monitor, the vast majority of traffic to our website is for meeting information. Our website's listing of meetings are now the most complete it has ever been with 12 different Intergroups and Districts participating! This means that we now list all the meetings and groups in Area 59 with the exception of District 46, in which case we provide a link to their website. There has been a lot of activity on the "back end" as we sort out technical issues getting all of the meeting lists to feed properly into ours without errors. These feeds are regularly refreshed to be sure the most current, up-to-date meeting information is synched with our list.
- CALENDAR. Find out what's happening and submit your event!
- AREA 59 BUSINESS. Everything you need is right here. We have newly enhanced forms, committee info and reports, contacts, service resources, district info, and so much more. Be sure to visit the Archives which lives in the "About Area 59" section!

The gratitude I feel for our committee members and special servants is enormous. Great thanks to our Area Officers for entrusting us with this important mission.

Spotlight on District 43

Greetings from District 43! We're somewhat on the outskirts of Area 59 so many people aren't very familiar with the happenings up here. We have a strong recovery community! Our members are enthusiastic about our recovery, welcoming new members into AA, and sharing the solution that we've found. We frequently attract students into the rooms as they grapple with their disease and determine if AA is right for them.

District 43 is located on the western edge of Area 59. The district serves Centre and Clinton

Counties which encapsulate the area in and around State College, Bellefonte, Lock Haven, Penn's Valley,
Howard and Renovo. Much of the district activity is centered in State College and Bellefonte. While the
size of our district is large; the actual population is relatively sparse outside of the latter two towns.

We have about 40 groups in the district that hold around 6 to 8 meetings daily. While meeting
attendance fell during the height of the Covid pandemic, it has been slowly rebounding this year.

Roughly 30% of our district's groups have a GSR representing them at our monthly district meetings.

This percentage is currently at a low point – this can partially be attributed to Covid as the district
meeting attendance has mirrored regular meeting attendance. At our district level we have several
standing subcommittees doing service. These are Corrections, Archives, CPC, Structure, Visitation, PI,
and Website. As previously mentioned, our lower than historical participation at district meetings has
unfortunately left some vacancies on these committees.

Anyone familiar with District 43 knows about our quarterly Medallion Night. Every 3 months one of our local groups hosts a Friday night event dedicated to celebrating sober anniversaries. At Medallion Night, anyone that had an anniversary, (whether days, months, or years) in the prior 3 months, is invited to share on their recovery journey. It's our sober pep rally! We tally up all of the

anniversaries which often surpasses 400 years of sober time between all who shared.

The ins and outs of our district will likely sound familiar to anyone who has spent some time in AA. We are a microcosm of AA as a whole. We are regular people in a small community who have found a solution to their drinking problem. We are eager to share the common solution and the joy that it brings. If your travels happen to bring you up to the State College area, stop into a meeting and see us. You'll be sure to make some fast friends!
