### Meeting Opening:

Tara C., Chairperson Panel 75, opened the meeting with the Declaration of Unity and thanked the hosting district, District 34. Tara C. read from “Leadership In AA: Ever a Vital Need” from the “AA Service Manual.”

### Traditions and Concepts:

- Tradition 10 – Deborah H., DCM D26
  - ☐ Article published by Bill W., April 1946 in Grapevine. 12 points to assure our future but the article is called “Our AA Experience has taught us that...” Early turmoil in Fellowship in 1940s (Washingtonians experience) – Drafted the Traditions at Wit’s End in NY.
  - ☐ Wanted to scream from the highest mountain she was alcohol free in the beginning but learned this Tradition.
  - ☐ This Tradition works to keep the Fellowship as a whole from engaging in public controversy and can apply to all our affairs.
  - ☐ Take 12 Alcoholics, ask for their opinion and can get 14 opinions. Many AA members have strong opinions and these help AA grow.
- Tradition 11 – Olivia A., DCM D63
  - ☐ When she first learned this Tradition, she had a lot of assumptions that weren’t true. Learned this is regarding the General Public and not anonymity within the Fellowship. We are not anonymous amongst ourselves.
  - ☐ Cannot broadcast ourselves as a member of AA. Cannot go on a radio show saying that we are a member of AA.
  - ☐ It is possible to be too anonymous in AA. Visiting a member in a hospital and not knowing their last name. Need to be present and available for people trying to find us.
  - ☐ Misconception that AA cannot be seen to the public at all (like commercials, advertisements, etc.) – We have PI and CPC committees that do these things so we are not too anonymous to the public.
  - ☐ Attraction rather than promotion. Anonymous enough to protect ourselves but not too anonymous where people don’t come through the doors.
- Tradition 12 – Kyle W., DCM D60
  - ☐ Makes a distinction between secrecy and anonymity. We are not a secret society. Need to make sure people know we exist.
  - ☐ Not a violation to advertise on buses, can let our friends and family know we are in AA but violation to brag about it, can talk about principles about AA but cannot make ourselves the

spokesperson for AA.

- ☐ Can just say AA helped us.

### **Roll Call | Secretary, Lauren B.**

- The Secretary conducted roll call. 6 officers were present, and 37 Districts represented, for a total of 43 out of 54 eligible voting members. Please see the roll call tally attached at the end for details.

### **Acceptance of Minutes from Prior Quarterly Meeting | Chairperson, Tara C.**

- Tara verified members read the September draft minutes (sent a month prior and available on Area59aa.org), and if there were any corrections or changes before voting to approve.
- The minutes were unanimously approved, with none opposed.

### **Acceptance of Minutes from EPGSA | Chairperson, Tara C.**

- Tara verified members read the draft minutes from EPGSA (sent a month prior and available on Area59aa.org), and if there were any corrections or changes before voting to approve.
- The minutes were unanimously approved, with none opposed.

### **Archivist Presentation | Area Archivist, Donald H. – DCM Sharing Session**

- Thanked the Area for sending him to NERF. Donald H., Area Archivist, shared that Carolyn W., AAWS Director, gave him 2 items that were published in Area 79 at NERF: 1) "The Bottle Book" – AA Comes to the BC/Yukon Area; and 2) "Pioneers in Skirts" – Women's Stories from the BC/Yukon Area. Excellent examples that Areas can use to publish about how AA came to their Area.
- A gentleman named Dan donated items to the Area. The first printing of the Daily Reflection and AA Way of Life (now known as As Bill Sees It). Donated a couple of other items. Real keeper is he donated an original Letter signed by Bill W which is now framed. Letter was written to York, PA on October 12, 1966.
- We are starting to accumulate things in our Archives that are very valuable. Need to make these items visible to the Fellowship. Come to the Archives room at EPGSA and see these items, invite Donald to District and Workshops and he will bring items.
- Read the current issue of Box 4-5-9 that is out – celebrates 50 years of AA Archives.
- February 1984 – In Structure Committee report, talked about ideas they wanted to address (such as DCM/ADCM workshop). April 14<sup>th</sup> they had a new project - DCM workshop to indoctrinate them in all the necessary areas to be of optimum assistance to themselves and GSR for elections of officers. June 10<sup>th</sup> – planned for September 30<sup>th</sup> (and Donald showed the flyer). December 9<sup>th</sup>, 1984, sent recommendations to have a new workshop in early 1985 for new DCMs to answer a lot of their questions and determine if this should be a yearly event. 2 DCM Workshops in February 1985. Had them in 1985 – 1987. Delegate recommended Structure Committee continuing them in 1988 and 1990. 1992 – Delegate recommended that the Area Chair be tasked with chairing the DCM Orientation. First time Orientation mentioned, instead of Workshop. 1994 – recommended that Structure develop agenda for DCM Workshop / Informational Forum to inform DCMs what their duties may be at the Area level. 1995 – Structure in January developed an Agenda to assist DCMs learn what their duties are at the Area level. June 10 – recommended that they hold a workshop for DCM / ADCM for workshop before each panel prior to Quarterly meeting and every 2 years after

that. 1996 - Delegate recommended that Structure hold a DCM Orientation workshop prior to the March 1997 Area meeting. January 14, 2001 – DCM Orientation was in the Area Calendar for the very first time! In 2002 – Delegate recommended that there be a 2<sup>nd</sup> DCM Orientation early in year 2 of the panel to address DCM issues. All these years the Mini Plannings were held as separate events. They at one time had a planning committee made up of Area Officers and DCMs that did it and they had hotel arrangements for an overnight stay to plan it. At December 2009 Area Meeting under New Business, D27 DCM said consider to change to include Mini Planning and DCM Sharing Session in 2010. Chairperson had the authority to do that but apparently didn't because a separate Mini Planning Session was held in January. In 2010, Structure highlighted DCM Orientation and DCM Sharing Session and Mini Planning Meeting. Practice of a combined orientation / planning meeting continues to this day.

### **Officer Reports:**

#### **Officer at Large, Katie M.**

- New OAL – Has been getting acclimated with Fellowship Connection. If you have any changes, please submit the form on the Area website so she can update it in Fellowship Connection.
- Meeting with Ad Hoc Digital Comms Committee.
- Getting used to the role.

#### **Treasurer, Jen F.**

- Printed the P&L for last fiscal year and the contributions list from each District to both the Area and GSO.
- As far as the budget goes, for FY25 – total contributions were approx. \$99,500. 25% was online. \$2,350 in sales. \$103,000 for total income. Total expenses were \$98,500.

#### **Secretary, Lauren B.**

- No additional items to report since EPGSA.
- Made an amends to those who request printed copies and will be mailing them to them this week.
- Highlighted the Area Library and provided DCMs with a flyer.
- Recent items received are National Corrections Conference held in Nashville and the International Convention held in Vancouver.

#### **Chairperson, Tara C.**

- Up to date Service Calendar was passed out, as well as Chairperson's report.
- When submitting a Motion, it must be sent to the Chairperson to get it on the Quarterly Agenda Area. Must be sent 48 hours prior to the Pre-Area Officers' Meeting.
- A motion was submitted and it wasn't included in the Area Quarterly Meeting. DCM D67 requested to discontinue printed copies for the subcommittee reports and solely distribute digitally. It was not put on the Agenda because it could be handled through general consent. Would like for subcommittees to print just 8 – 10 reports. Officers would still print their reports.
- Show of hands for those not in favor:
  - D30 – Doesn't think it is realistic to do that. People aren't going to read it.
  - D40 – Doesn't care personally but there are people who want to see the paper copies in her District. If we print only a certain amount, what if we run out. Why are we not making a motion?

It was explained that the Chairperson has the flexibility.

- ☐ D63 – Suggestion to those who want printed copies can email Chairperson. If you prefer paper, email Chairperson and can make sure we have the copies printed. This can appease both parties.
- ☐ D30 – We will rely on Chairpersons giving verbal report only at Area meeting. – Chairperson will still give their verbal report.
- ☐ D25 – We will receive them ahead of time so we can print ourselves, right? Yes, that is correct.
- ☐ Show of hands – Passed.
- Will give it a try for next Quarterly meeting and see if it works. Tara will make sure copies get emailed out to everyone ahead of time.
- Thanked the Area for sending her to NERF.

#### **Alternate Delegate, Alex N.**

- Thanked those for volunteering at EPGSA and thanked the Area for sending him to NERF.
- Hosted a workshop on Service Sponsorship at NERF.
- Submitted a report for the Quarterly meeting with updates. As Intergroup Liaison, SEPIA / Area 59 Share A Day Planning Meeting on 1/4/26, and actual Share A Day on 1/31/26 in Levittown. Flyers have been passed around.
- 3/6 – 8 – SEPIA Round Up at Grand Hotel in Cape May, NJ.
- All Intergroup Share A Day at Easy Does It Center. Flyers are also available.
- YPAA Liaison – NECYPAA expanded to be Northeast Conference. NECYPAA will be held 1/9 – 1/11 in New Hampshire and 1/10 will be hybrid forum about future expansion.
- DCM Sharing Session will be on 1/24/26. Program and Flyer has been provided. Will be a great day.

#### **Delegate, Dan B.**

- **Convention Committee Report – On Behalf of Pete B., Convention Committee Chairperson**
  - ☐ Gratitude for a great convention and attendance. 690 total registrations. \$1,900 went to GSO from 7<sup>th</sup> Tradition contributions on Saturday. 248 Gallons of Coffee consumed. 15 cases of water.
  - ☐ Total 57 critique sheets submitted. - Convenient for registration and booking hotel. Some dismay about checking in online and then checking in again. 30% found that 1 meal was unsatisfactory. Program schedule and content good review, good speakers, app was good. Can do better to let people know that the app is available. Many liked the hospitality suite.
  - ☐ It is great to receive the notes of gratitude from the Fellowship. Lots of notes saying how inspired people were, how much they learned, how excited they are to serve AA. That is what EPGSA is all about!
- OAL – Offered amends for lack of transparency and will be more transparent in the future. All decisions at the time considered the welfare of Area first and was based on the information we had at the time. Key duty as Delegate is to make sure that the Area is functioning well. Critical to have a properly working Registrar position to do time group updates, reports, and email communication. It was a new situation that was never dealt with before. Hindsight we would have handled things differently. Made best decision at the time. Received emails in March / early April timeframe that OAL wasn't answering emails. Went over importance of timely responding to emails in May at Pre-

Area Officers Meeting. Found out almost no updates were made in Fellowship Connection at that May meeting since beginning of the panel. Since it was an emergency situation and we needed to address the backlog, asked Claire B., Panel 73 OAL, to help temporarily to help with backlog in hopes that OAL would assist and once backlog was cleared, he would take over and handle the workload. OAL raised the issue and requested to have an Assistant Registrar position and Delegate requested that tangible evidence be provided to justify the new position. Officers didn't realize the difficulties and challenges that the position faced. Also made mention that we are a team and we are here to help one another. Temporary help turned out to be no longer temporary. In August, Claire was assisting and raised the issue that she shouldn't be using her personal email. An Area email address was created so she didn't use her personal address. Email may have been confusing and didn't consider the impact it may have had. At August Pre-Area Officer Meeting, OAL was still struggling. Forcefully emphasized that the elected person needs to be the point person to be of assistance and not fair to the Area or to Claire to have Claire do most of the work. At September Quarterly Meeting, we should have said something to the Area about what was going on, but we were hoping it would have turned around and that everything would have been fine. It is hard to share that someone is having a hard time at the mic. Wanted to give every opportunity for OAL to succeed. Had the Area Inventory and there were a lot of issues raised there, and it was clear that the situation was untenable. After a lot of thought and consultation with the other officers, the only thing we could do to best ensure the proper functioning of the Registrar and Registrar related responsibilities was to ask the OAL to resign. Not an easy decision. Under Concept 9 & 10, have to make tough decisions. Seemed like it wouldn't be possible for him to fulfill his job responsibilities. Had been almost a year and no progress. Nothing personal – it is about principle, what the Area needs to function effectively. Issue was the required work wasn't getting done. Asked Neill to resign week before EPGSA. Did not immediately offer to do so, additional discussions were held, and Neill was present at November Pre-Area Officer meeting (Concept 5). Neill provided additional information about specific challenges and struggles he faced not known to us, were willing to have additional conversations to see if there were any possible way to make things work. Neill did eventually offer his resignation on 11/29/25 after a lot of thought about what was best for him and his ability to serve on the rest of the panel. Officers then quickly met and we followed the process in the Area Structure Manual and offered the position to Katie M. who accepted the position the next day. At all times we acted on the best information we had at the time. The overall consideration was to ensure that everything was properly functioning in the Area. Truly believe we have a strong foundation in place and hearing Katie is doing a good job so far. Deeply care about AA and the Area and hope you can trust in our decisions.

- Area Inventory – Received good feedback. Reviewed the information as officers and will continue to do so.
- EPGSA was a great event and thanked everyone for their attendance, feedback, participation, and volunteering. The feedback will really help him with the Area's group conscience on the Founder's writing. The guests were very impressed. Racy J. was impressed by Guest Observer practice and Dan will be speaking on the Grapevine Podcast in January 2026 about it. Will keep everyone posted.
- Thanked everyone for his and the officers' attendance at NERF.
- 76<sup>th</sup> GSC is coming up. Printed Final Conference Reports were given out at EPGSA but more available today at the Quarterly.
- CPC Conference Committee – Met twice with Treatment & Accessibilities CPC chair. Prioritization call to meet with Trustees committee and weigh in if PAIs should be brought to the Conference or not. For CPC, 2 were worthy of discussion and 1 will be going to the Conference: Whenever we

post video clips, want to make sure there are short clips to use in other places which is in line with what they wanted to do anyway. The other one was to turn on comments on LinkedIn page. Comment moderation would be a full-time job and that one is not going on the agenda.

- Attending Board weekend at the end of January with other Committee Chairs. Will get to see the process of how it all works and will get to mix and mingle with Trustees and other Committees Chairs.
- PAI – A list of all current PAIs and the status. It is in Delegate’s folder, which is always available. Can look at those items. Those that are marked “Forwarded to Conference” will be the only ones discussed at Conference. Free to distribute to groups but be mindful of that.
- Preliminary Agenda coming soon. Final list will be in February after Board weekend. End of February will get the Background. Timeline is short and the biggest issue but will try to mitigate it and get it out to everyone as soon as possible.
- PCSS - In April, we will have PCSS. Will send out a survey. Talk about it with GSRs now. 4/11/26 in Lebanon, PA. Will have GSRs do the presentations. Worked very well and most engaging PCSS. Encourage GSRs to do presentations. Helps groups be involved in the process.
- GSO – Bob W. sent an email about declining contributions and requested that the Fellowship send contributions so we can be fully self-supporting. Contributions are over \$1 million less than last year. Literature sales are a little bit up. For us to continue to do the work, we need more contributions. Running as lean as possible but to take on more Agenda Items, work, etc. we will need more contributions. Consider sending more to GSO and less to other entities.
- Consider sending \$12.12 to be self-supporting.
- 24 new documents in folder since last quarter. Top thing to look at are: GSO Quarterly Report, Box 4-5-9, and AAWS Updates. There are also updates on Retrofit. New section for Meeting Guide app to search for online meetings.
- NERAASA 2026 – Discussing topics that can affect AA as a whole and AA’s future. Will be discussing Agenda Items. Outreach is still looking for volunteers.

### **DCM Actions:**

- Lindsay E., D51:
  - ☐ Has your District ever done a GSO bus trip and how was it funded?
    - D27 – Yes, when he was ADCM he organized the trip. District was financially healthy and funded it 100%. \$2,500 for the trip. 60 people attended.
    - D44 – Had excess funds and it was voted to spend those funds on a GSO Bus Trip. GSRs had a fee of \$5 just so they could get an accurate headcount. Have to communicate with GSO to get into the building. GSRs bought their own food.
    - D40 – 9 or 10 years ago, they did not fund it. Don’t have a lot of money. Anyone was able to go and they bought their own bus ticket. Did feed them lunch.
    - D41 – Organized a bus trip to GSO with 50 people and was \$2,000. \$40 a ticket and District covered it. Poconos Intergroup Activities Committee took over that and then are going to do a trip in May 2026. Allocated a bus. \$2,000 for bus, \$40 a ticket, 50 people max. Will try to lock it in to do in the fall as well. Bus company is going to increase their prices.
  - ☐ How do you determine which motions that you have the GSRs bring back / what are voted on right then and there without bringing back to home group?
    - D49 – This happened on Friday. The general consensus is do they need to bring it back? Do they feel confident voting on behalf of their group or feel the need to bring it back?

- D40 – Still struggles with it. Past DCM wanted everything to go back to homegroups. It is hard for her because there is no written direction on it. Anything that comes from Area, she sends to them and has them take it back. Anything on Agenda Items, she has them take back. Anything affecting their District budget over \$50 she has the GSRs send back. No concrete answer.
- D63 – Anything that would directly affect District 63, GSRs and the home group should have a vote. For example, PAI from D51 for Audio versions of books – she instructed GSRs to bring back to home groups because it will affect all of AA. When it comes to District budget and Officers expense budgets, it doesn't need to be brought back for discussion. Provides the budget to them for transparency but not needed for them to vote on.
- ☐ Experience with motion on re-evaluating the spending of funds? – Revoting on a motion that was already voted on previously.
  - D40 – No. Reminds her of a General Service Area wanting to revote on changes to 12 x 12 and preamble. It would probably have to be a new motion.
  - D63 – Asked if the Chairperson could give opinion.
  - Chairperson – There is a motion to rescind but no action can be taken. If money was put down, cannot make a motion to rescind. Can also amend a previously adopted motion and revisited instead of funding fully, fund partially.
  - D35 – Once something is voted on, if it goes one way can present minority opinion. Once expressed, can revote on the issue. Once voted on and accepted, can bring as new motion.
  - D49 – Friday – There was a practice in the District about supporting groups that were having anniversaries. Had a group and they asked for contributions from District to have that. Brought it up in discussion and it became clear that the GSRs did not want to send money back to the groups that they contributed from the groups to the District. It was a new motion to get rid of an old practice.
- Olivia A., D63:
  - ☐ Bus Trip to GSO – All the previous feedback answered her question.

#### **Archives | Colleen M., DCM D30**

- No updates since EPGSA.

#### **Corrections | Sharon R., DCM D23**

- DCM, D23 Sharon R. gave a presentation on the 8<sup>th</sup> National Corrections Conference which was held in Nashville, TN in November 2025. She took 33 pages of notes and was so inspired by the entire weekend and all the speakers.
- Area 59 – 27 Correctional facilities with tablets, 2,508 starts, 1,276 completed – Usage is being tracked to see progress being made
- One of the biggest stumbling blocks for former inmates is getting volunteer status to bring AA meetings behind the walls.
- Steps to Starting a Prison Sponsorship Service Packet – Forwarded this to Committees and Intergroups in Area 59. Digital copies and paper copies are available to anyone interested in them.

#### **CPC/PI | Mark B., DCM D27**

- Making progress on getting new shades.
- Some events are coming up. One in District 30 (PI Conference Day) on 2/1 and some other events

that are outward facing.

- Lindsay put together surveys that were distributed to DCMs to be completed and handed back to someone on the committee.

#### **Finance | Andrew D., DCM D66**

- No updates since EPGSA.

#### **Grapevine / La Viña | Erin R., DCM D40**

- Elected a new Secretary and have a new member Matt.
- Dates set for next 3 Area events.
