### **A Mini-History:**

In 1942 the Fellowship of Alcoholics Anonymous was in its seventh year, when Clinton Duffy, a pioneering warden, at San Quentin asked nearby A.A.s to carry the message to alcoholics in the prison. "If the A.A. program will help just one man, I want to start it." The first Correctional Facilities Committee was formed in 1977.
